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Neshaminy Teachers Call for Meeting With District Administrators to Address Educational Priorities

November 16, 2010-LANGHORNE, PA—Teachers in the Neshaminy School District have called for a meeting with administrators to discuss the school system’s educational priorities.

In their official request for a meeting, leaders of the Neshaminy Federation of Teachers said they could meet as early as today. School district officials said they would consider such a meeting but have not yet agreed to schedule one.

“It is essential that district officials set the educational priorities for our school system and its students,” said Louise Boyd, president of the Neshaminy Federation of Teachers. “Once those priorities are set, and the school staff and parents are fully informed, we can get to the hard work of achieving our goals.”

She added, “Teachers and certified staff in our schools stand ready to collaborate with administrators and the school board to implement the system’s educational priorities.”

Neshaminy teachers and the school district are in talks seeking a new contract. Teachers have been working under a contract that expired in July 2008. The next bargaining session is scheduled for Dec. 2.

This week teachers and certified staff ended a work-to-contract action and resumed performing the extra duties that they take on for their students and the District—including extracurricular activities, special events and college recommendations.

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
